UKRAINE APPEAL INFORMATION

The **Rev Keith Brindle**, vicar of St James's Church in Devizes, who is helping to home refugees through the Love Ukraine Devizes appeal group organised a meeting in Devizes to give updates on what is happening in aid.

He said: "We are raising money to support Ukrainian refugees in transit to Devizes, those in the Lesko refugee centre, a town in Poland that Devizes is linked with, as well as refugees in Devizes.

"Money raised will provide accommodation and emergency needs of refugees due to come to Devizes, to support the refugee centre in Lesko and support refugees and host families once the guests have arrived."

Message from Cllr Richard Clewer, Leader of Wilts Council

Thank you to our sponsors providing a home for Ukrainian refugees

Firstly, I want to say thank you to the many warm-hearted people of Wiltshire who have offered up their homes for Ukrainian refugees. We are grateful to you for taking that leap of faith and offering your home to people who you do not know but who have touched your heart and you want to help. We know your words are matched with generous actions and you are offering a safe place to stay for many fleeing the ravages of war. Latest figures show more than 280 Wiltshire households have been matched with Ukrainian refugees as people fleeing the war-torn country start arriving in the county (approximately 1,500 households have registered).

Sponsors providing homes for refugees are being advised they don't need to contact the council when a match has been made as the government provides the information so DBS and accommodation checks can be carried out. However, once the guests have arrived we are asking for sponsors to email refugees@wiltshire.gov.uk so support can begin straightaway.

Alongside partners, we have produced a welcome pack available at [Support for Ukraine](#). This page also has information and frequently asked questions for those involved in supporting Ukrainian refugees and people who want to find out more. It provides local information which sits alongside the [government information for refugees](#).

We will also be in contact with your guests regarding accessing benefits, health and school places. We hope you find this guide useful too.

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

The first Ukrainian settlers are due to arrive in The Lavingtons shortly, thanks to the compassion and support of a number of our neighbours. The thought that terrified and vulnerable families have been offered shelter and hope by local residents is amazing.

Locally, over 200 households have offered safe homes for people fleeing from the war-torn country. Wiltshire Council is putting in additional staffing to provide safety checks and support the growing number of Ukrainian refugees who are due to settle in Wiltshire and schools are working together with the council to continue education for young refugees. Voluntary groups and charities, including LoveUkraine – the Devizes support group, are helping to co-ordinate responses and develop ways to ensure that when families arrive they have the support they need.

Wiltshire school children raised more than £11,000 this month after the Wiltshire Youth Council invited schools to join in a non-uniform day. Proceeds have gone to the Disasters Emergency Committee's Ukraine Appeal after school children ditched their uniforms and wore blue and yellow in solidarity.

On the subject of local fundraising, the Devizes Area Board completely wiped out its remaining budgets at its last meeting in Devizes! I was very pleased that local councillors unanimously voted to direct grants of more than £41,000 to local projects including Great Cheverell Youth Club, Worton & Cheverell Football Club, Market Lavington's Broadwell Play Area and other fantastic local causes. With fresh new grants available, now is the time to get that community project you have been pondering off the ground! The Devizes Area Board and your local parish council would be thrilled to hear about any community focused initiative that you want to create and with cheque books at the ready I would encourage you to reach out for support!

In the last month West Lavington Youth Club has appointed a hugely experienced Youth Leader who is excited about building up activities for young people in the area. With the village hall based youth club and surrounding playing fields, this is great news for West Lavington, Market Lavington and surrounding villages. Dedicated volunteers in Great Cheverell have also stepped-up to setup a new youth club with financial support from Wiltshire Council. Brilliant news for our villages!

Any ideas you might have to improve our community, from youth activities and social events to environmental and nature-based projects could be supported by your local parish council and Wiltshire Council.

These are our villages so let's work together to make them better!

Salisbury Cathedral is nearing its 800 years anniversary

In the Works Yard at [Salisbury Cathedral](#), you will be greeted by a gentle rhythmic tapping that has endured for over 800 years. It's the tap-tap-tap of the stonemasons who have been working on this site even before the foundation stone was laid on April 28 1220, For the two female members of the team, historic precedents are shadowy at best; women and children were certainly labouring on the medieval site, but the precise nature of their work is largely undocumented. Former banker Sarah Klopper, 50, says that when she started out 12 years ago she was advised that stonemasonry was no job for a woman. She is suitably dismissive: "It's fine! There's still that mentality with some men where they've got to lift twice as much as anyone else. But we have modern lifting devices, and lots of rules and regulations to stop us doing stupid things. We're all capable."

THE ENVIRONMENT AND ENERGY

ARE MICRO-MOBILITY HIRE SCHEMES (e-bikes and ordinary bikes) the FUTURE and would it be something to introduce in the villages and Devizes to help reduce car use?

For example Quadrant Transport looks at what Manchester's new cycle hire scheme has achieved since launch.

A total of 26,776 miles have been ridden on the bikes over 16,725 journeys – enough to circumnavigate the entire globe.

The use of the bikes will be closely monitored, and learning will be fed in as the scheme rolls out throughout Summer 2022, when the scheme will also expand into Trafford.

Richard Nickson, Programme Director for Cycling and Walking at TfGM, told Quadrant Transport: "We're really pleased with how the cycle hire scheme has been received so far across Salford and Manchester. People are certainly putting the miles in on the bikes, which is great to see, and particularly exciting as the scheme continues to roll out in the summer."

To hire a bike all people need to do is download the Beryl app, provide a few details, locate a bike, unlock it and start riding. Users can then ride a bike which must be returned to any of the available stations. Additional charges will be applied if the bike is not returned to a cycle hire station at the end of the journey.

E bikes would be a good alternative to pedal bikes for the rural community who would like to cut down on using a car into town. Perhaps we ought to work on this as a potential project for the area?

RECYCLING WITH TERRA CYCLE

Can we put in a Terra Cycle Zero Waste Box for the residents of Eastcott, Easterton and Easterton Sands for all those things that we currently can't recycle through our local councils and facilities. Perhaps place it in the village Hall car park so that we can all use it without having to go into Devizes.

By diverting tonnes of hard-to-recycle waste from landfill or incineration, you'll actively be helping to protect our environment! Check out our recycling solutions zerowasteboxes.terracycle.co.uk

THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY - for more valuable information on what is happening in the changing economy and what could happen see: www.greenbiz.com

Designing the circular economy into the energy transition will allow us to move faster and more sustainably in getting to net-zero.

Another critical part of circular design is life extension. We should make durable products designed to be repurposed for other uses. **Used car batteries** which can no longer hold sufficient charge for the range needed in a motor vehicle still hold a residual capacity of 60-80 percent and can be effectively used in other applications that require lower performance, such as stationary energy storage to support the grid. This is already happening, albeit not at full scale. For example the stadium of Dutch football club Ajax [used second hand Nissan leaf batteries](#) to create a storage unit equivalent to the supply power to 7,000 homes in one hour. At present this is the largest commercial storage system which combines power conversion capturing energy from 4,200 solar panels and storing in the batteries.

The Potential of Allotments in Easterton

In the last issue of the Echoes the Parish Council asked for residents who would be interested in having a vegetable/garden plot in an Allotment in Easterton to get in contact. Sadly, to date we have had no interest at all from anyone who wishes to grow their own vegetables or flowers. We had thought that there might have been a big interest in gardening especially since the pandemic.

So before we look for alternate uses and Plan B for the intended plot we have earmarked in the village.
