Opening Ceremony - Saturday 17th July (subject to Government regulations)

The grand reopening ceremony open to all the public and our local MP, Danny Kruger, who will officiate for the opening. This will give you the opportunity to come along and see the new hall in all its glory. Refreshments will be available.

THE VILLAGE HALL TODAY

The good news is that the contractors have finished the hall modernisation work. The trustees have raised and spent £250,000 and you now have a hall that is fit for purpose for our community. The Hall now has excellent WIFI (super fast Broadband) throughout the hall. Other facilities include the Garden Room, the suite of modern accessible toilets serving both of the function rooms and on site Parking.

The main hall has a seated capacity of 100 (150 standing), the stage and a smaller function room named The Garden Room. (NB. Please see the present COVID restrictions below on limited capacity.)

The stage now has full lighting and sound facilities and a "Green Room" for theatre productions and events.

The Garden Room has a capacity of 40 seated and can be configured as a classroom or seminar room, fully wired with power and USB connections for 8 workstations and a coffee station. It is ideal for childrens' parties, offering direct access to the children's play area in the adjacent field.

A number of groups already hold regular gatherings, mostly on a weekly basis. These include a short mat bowls and social club, an art class, Marlborough and District Canine Society who conduct Ringcraft training, Easterton Archers, and Positive Connections – a dog scentwork and training group.

Regular village activities include the annual Country Fete, the Remembrance Sunday Curry Lunch and the Burns' Supper. Other groups such as Wardour Garrison and Wiltshire Home Guard hold less frequent meetings. As well as the stage, the hall offers a kitchen and separate bar/servery.

GARDENING TIPS FOR MAY

(Article taken from the Redhorn magazine)

1. May is a busy month in the garden – aren't they all? The last week of May is still early enough to get the bedding plants in, provided no late frosts are forecast.

Make sure that the soil around new fruit trees is not allowed to dry out while they are becoming established and do not allow grass to grow up to the trees for at least three years. A feed of rose fertiliser is often beneficial. Cut off dead flower heads and thin out weak shoots from shrubs that have finished flowering. Newly planted shrubs need plenty of water during dry periods.

2. Continue sowing salad vegetables, runner beans and French beans. Or sow a packet of looseleaf salad mix in a wooden fruit box, lined with perforated black plastic and filled with multipurpose compost. For cut-and-come-again leaves, make sure you start clipping when the leaves are small.

3. Deadhead spring bulbs and plant out more border perennials. Divide existing congested perennials and replant the separated clumps in freshly cultivated soil. Sow hardy annuals for inexpensive summer colour, and plant dahlia tubers, ensuring that the crowns are about 8 cm. below the surface of the soil, before covering with soil. Plant up hanging baskets and window-boxes.

4. Mow lawns regularly and treat with a moss-killer before raking out dead moss. Apply a lawn weedkiller if necessary. This is also a good time to grow new lawns from seed but make sure you water frequently if the weather is dry.

5. House plants need much more water at this time of year and a liquid feed can be added to the water once a week. A wide range of house plants can be propagated from leaf and stem cuttings this month.

RECYCLING UPDATES FOR UNWANTED

UK wastes more electronic gizmos and products etc than anywhere else in world !

LAPTOPS AND TABLETS from across the county will be responsibly recycled thanks to a new partnership between non-profit Wiltshire Digital Drive and Blackmore Ricotech.

The Warminster-based company has become the official recycling partner of the Wiltshire Digital Drive and will provide a data secure, and environmentally friendly, solution for any machines that are too old or broken for the non-profit company to work on.

Kieran Thomas, co-director of Wiltshire Digital Drive, said: "Everyone has been so generous with their donations, but unfortunately some machines were either just too old or damaged for us to refurbish.

The recycling company will collect and recycle the machines so the precious metals inside can be used again.

It operates a zero waste to landfill policy on all IT and technology equipment and will reuse, or recycle, 100 percent of the equipment it collects.

The useful reclaimed elements are then sold, with the money raised used to help benefit communities in the South West through Blackmore Ricotech's own initiative, Donate IT. Simon Barfoot, director at Blackmore Ricotech, said: "Gadgets that we throw away, like laptops, mobile phones and tablets are a rich source of precious metals. By recovering them we can contribute towards creating a truly circular economy.

Up to 78 percent went into the recycling stream with 100 percent of the materials recovered going back into the economy to be manufactured into new products.

Sending the machines to Blackmore Ricotech to be recycled will also offset the carbon usage by the Community Interest Company (CIC).

UPDATE ON LIFE AT COURTYARD SURGERY.

Both the blackbird and the Collared Dove that built nests in the Front Courtyard have raised chicks which successfully flew the nest.

Because of COVID a one way system was put in place at the surgery, at first this used plastic mats and plastic marquees to provide shelter, but now a permanent structure with a roof and wheelchair access has been built by Gaigers. We have decided to use soft landscaping rather than steel fencing beside the path. Streetscene have been contacted and a second planter will be put in front of the surgery to make the edge of the slope more visible. The lawn has been reseeded with wild flowers, and there is a box hedge beside the path within the garden.

NHS England still insists on total triage, so patients will continue to get a phone call from a doctor before being offered a face to face appointment. The barriers in front of reception have been removed, and because the rules on disinfecting rooms between patients have just been relaxed there will be more appointments available for blood tests, smears etc. We will not be restarting ear syringing, but spirometry tests will be starting again. These will probably be in the front garden until rules are relaxed further.

Sharon Kenchington has left us, to work closer to home, but we will soon be joined by Amy, in the patient support team.

The quarterly newsletter on the website is changing to a 6 weekly one which will include specials, where we

concentrate on one aspect of healthcare. The latest is a carers special.

There is a link on the website to Doctorlink, which provides online consultations. This uses the same question as NHS111 and will give advice between "Go straight to A&E" to "ask your pharmacist for advice", including make an appointment with your GP, in 24hours, 2 days, 4 days or 14 days. We are assessing what is available and may change supplier in the next few months. Some options are website based others are app. based.

We are continuing to book people in for COVID vaccination and our rates continue to be above the Wiltshire and National averages.

WALKING AND DRIVING ON THE PLAIN – RULES AND REGULATIONS

SALISBURY PLAIN TRAINING AREA SPTA NEWSLETTER MINISTRY OF DEFENCE

Driving dangerously is an invitation to disaster anywhere, but it could be even worse on the training estate. Many roads on MOD land are uneven and you never know what's around the corner – you might crash into a troop of soldiers or even a tank. And trust us, the tank will win. Plenty of people driving on MOD land do so safely and in accordance with the laws. Those who don't are taking their lives in their hands. If you're driving on the military training estate, stick to Public Rights of Way or Permissive Rights of Way that are open to the public, and drive sensibly and carefully.

IGNORING RED FLAGS AND WANDERING INTO A LIVE FIRING AREA

Don't be like the teenagers who ignored the red flags and rode their quad bikes onto the training estate, popping up just behind the targets as a group of soldiers was about to start firing at them.

HOW PEOPLE RISK THEIR LIVES ON THE PLAIN

Red flags or lights signal that the land is being used for life threatening activities and that public access is completely prohibited. Armoured vehicles, bullets, pyrotechnics and fast moving vehicles are all a threat.

You could probably excuse a lack of knowledge about the dangers in 1941 but in 2018, with better technology and instant access to information – there is no excuse for ignoring the messages that are out there or not being aware of the inherent dangers on the military training estate.

Firing times for many sites are posted online and should be correct but there are sometimes changes so what you see on the ground takes precedence. If the firing times online say the site is open, but a red flag says it's closed, **it's closed**

PICKING UP MILITARY DEBRIS – EVEN THOUGH IT MIGHT EXPLODE!

We know that pieces of twisted metal sticking up from the soil look interesting. They might even be the remains of some munitions. This might seem prey cool...until they blow up in your hands.

When you're out and about on a military training area, don't pick anything up. Although we do our best to clear up ordnance, some does get missed and it can be dangerous.

DON'T TOUCH ANYTHING AND KEEP A CLOSE EYE ON CHILDREN AND PETS.
