Care of the environment.


Provision of allotments.

Nick is the Coordinator of the Easterton Country Fête Committee

Who, in history, do you admire the most and why? Abraham Lincoln because he came from the poorest background you can imagine and rose to high office and, despite all the difficulties, his ability to manage people was supreme.

My most interesting job was running the Reserve Forces and Cadets Association for Wales in Cardiff where we were a service provider and I believe we were able to make a real difference.

Who/what is your favourite author/book?

I enjoy history, particularly military history, and there are numerous military authors, Anthony Beevor being one.

Do you have a favourite composer or music artist? I enjoy all sorts of music but Fleetwood Mac is one of my favourites.

WILTSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS

SHARE YOUR VIEWS ON THE DRAFT WILTSHIRE DESIGN GUIDE

We are asking for your views on a draft guide that, if formally adopted, will help to ensure that future developments in the county are consistently of a high-quality design.

The draft Wiltshire Design Guide has been structured around the '10 characteristics of good design', as described in the National Design Guide, and if adopted will be used as a supplementary planning document. A consultation is now under way and runs until Monday 31 July.

POTHOLE REPORTS

Last week, from 3-9 July, we filled a total of 290 potholes and had 119 reported to us.

When we receive a pothole report, it is assessed by an engineer, and given a priority based on our defect criteria, as set out in our <u>Highways Safety Inspection Manual</u>.

We aim to fix Priority 1 potholes by the end of the next day, while Priority 2 will be fixed within 14 days, Priority 3 in 28 days, Priority 4 in 60 days, and Priority 5 are referred to a manager for further consideration. Please report any potholes on Wiltshire's roads to us using MyWilts.

WILTSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS contd.

In July Wiltshire Council considered the review of the Wiltshire Local Plan. The draft Plan sets out the vision and framework for housing, infrastructure and land for employment growth for the next 15 years. Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the Plan, making it the most important place- shaping document for Wiltshire

A number of important policies are included in the draft plan:

- A target of 40% of all new housing on developments of 10 homes or more to be affordable. This is often reduced following viability discussions.
- Greater flexibility for rural exception sites to make it easier to provide affordable housing in villages where there is clearly identified local demand.
- New developments will have to meet zero carbon standards, including energy generation such as solar panels.
- 20% biodiversity net gain for all new developments, compared to the 10% legal requirement.
- All new developments must also have to support cycling and walking connections.

This Local Plan is about providing for a choice of high-quality designed housing, including affordable homes, in the most sustainable locations; maximising development on brownfield sites; supporting town centres; and providing high quality new public open spaces.

The proposed Local Plan is available on the Wiltshire Council website and the consultation will open later this year.
