WILTSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS

SHARE YOUR VIEWS ON THE DRAFT WILTSHIRE DESIGN GUIDE

The draft Wiltshire Design Guide has been structured around the '10 characteristics of good design', as described in the National Design Guide, and if adopted will be used as a supplementary planning document. A consultation is now under way and runs until Monday 31 July.

LOCAL PLAN CONSULTATION BEGINS NEXT MONTH WITH IN-PERSON AND ONLINE EVENTS - PLEASE LOOK AND SHARE YOUR VIEWS

The consultation for the Wiltshire Local Plan begins on Wednesday 27th September and ends at 23:59 on 22nd November, with in-person events being held across the county to enable you to find out more.

The Wiltshire Council is holding 16 drop-in events at libraries and leisure centres around Wiltshire and a live webinar-style event on Microsoft Teams. You can just turn up to the in-person events, but you will need to [register beforehand for the online event](#).

If you cannot make your local in-person event, you are welcome to attend any of the others to discuss the plan and your own area – all events are open to all.

The Local Plan sets out the vision and framework for housing, infrastructure and land for employment growth for the next 15 years. Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the plan, making it the most important place-shaping document for Wiltshire.

RECYCLING

“Sort it before you bring it” – help us recycle as much as possible at our household recycling centres

First, we asked you to help sort your kerbside collection waste, to great success, and now we're asking for you to please step-up once again so that we can recycle even more at our household recycling centres (HRCs). Our data shows that more than a third of the items put in the general rubbish skips at our HRCs could have been recycled.

With that in mind, as part of our 'Recycling: Let's Sort It' campaign we encourage you to sort your waste out before you visit your local HRC, ensuring that all items are separated correctly.

If you don't have time to do this before you set off, we will soon be providing designated sorting areas at each of our HRCs to give you the opportunity to sort out your materials on-site as easily as possible - with our friendly staff on hand to provide advice and guidance.
